	Research <u>storage</u> providers if your move is temporary.
	Organise overseas <u>pet transport</u> .
	Sell belongings that you don't want to take with you.
	Book flights.



One Month Before Moving Overseas Checklist

The next crucial time frame on your moving house spreadsheet is about a month prior to your relocation abroad. This should cover the following:

Notify key service providers:
• Lawyer
 Accountant, bookkeeper or financial advisor
 Insurance service provider/s
• Banks
Superannuation fund provider
Australian Taxation Office
The Electoral Commission
Car registration
 Physicians, family dentist, medical specialists, therapists,
veterinarian
 Various utility companies, i.e., electricity, water and internet
• Realtor
Australia Post
 Local council and other councils in areas where you have
investment properties

One Week Before International Relocation **Checklist**

Next on your moving overseas checklist are the things you need to cover about a week before your scheduled move.

Exchange money to foreign currency.
Start packing.
Clean your house.

After Moving Overseas Checklist
